

OVERVIEW





A very humid air mass over our area for the next two days may trigger thunderstorms with very heavy rainfall from this afternoon thru Saturday evening. Flood Watches have been issued for northern CT and Fairfield county in southern CT.


A 4-day heat wave is forecast next week from Sunday through Wednesday with a continuation of very humid conditions.

NAMHRES Rainfall Forecast



The NAMHRES model is forecasting the rainfall to be very scattered in nature. Scattered swaths of rain of 2 to 4" over the next 36 hours.

Rainfall rates of 1'' - 2'' per hour are possible in any thunderstorms that develop.

Strong Winds (<5%)


Large Hail (<5%)

Stream Flooding (10%)




Severe thunderstorms are not expected. However, the primary risk is from very heavy rainfall in non-severe thunderstorms this afternoon thru Saturday afternoon.
